This course is designed to facilitate the acquisition of strong French communication skills in the areas of speaking, reading, writing, and listening. The students in this course should be able to communicate at an advanced level. An emphasis will be placed on developing oral and written communication, as well as comprehension skills. Students will prepare an IB oral exam and write a written exam in May for this course.

Students are expected to complete assigned readings and homework in preparation for class every day. Homework is posted in class and on the Sydney Academy Homework website daily. Sydney Academy is following the new Attendance Policy as set out by the CBRSB. In French classes, attendance is important, as the classroom is primarily where students will practice speaking French

If on the day that an assignment is due, a student is unable to be in class (for reasons such as illness), he/she is required to either mail me the assignment electronically, or have someone bring the assignment to school for them (unless an arrangement is made with me in advance). I will accept a late assignment up to seven days after the due date, although points will be deducted for every day it is late. In the case of prolonged illness or travel, arrangements with regards to due dates must be made with me in advance.

The term mark for this class is calculated using 80% of the semester's class work (tests, assignments, projects, communication, daily tasks, etc.) and 20% from comprehensive testing and major tests.
